<p style="text-align: center;">NOTICE OF REFUSAL TO WAIVE RIGHTS AGAINST UNREASONABLE SEARCH AND SEIZURE</p>	

Comes now Respondent, Suzanne Shell, in response to Complainant's Notice to Take Deposition and Subpoena, and states as follows:

1. Deposition is scheduled to be taken at 20 E. Vermijo, Room 437, Colorado Springs, Colorado. This location is a courthouse.
2. Entry into this building is conditional upon the individual's voluntary waiver of rights against unreasonable search and seizure under the Fourth Amendment.
3. Respondent is compelled under subpoena to attend this deposition. Her presence at this time and location is not voluntary.
4. Respondent hereby gives notice that she will not, voluntarily or otherwise, waive her rights against unreasonable search and seizure in order to enter the court building at 20 E. Vermijo in response to the subpoena. Respondent will appear at the courthouse at the appointed time but will not allow any court or security personnel to search her person, papers or effects as a condition of entry into that building without probable cause, supported by Oath or affirmation, particularly describing the place to be searched, and the persons or things to be seized. Respondent asserts there is no genuine probable cause to search her person, papers or effects.
5. If Petitioner wishes to depose the respondent, arrangements will have to be made to allow

the Respondent into the courthouse without being subjected to any search. Alternatively, Petitioner will have to move the location of the deposition to a facility that will not require the Respondent to waive any rights in order to obtain entry to comply with the subpoena.
